Items of interest from this year's GCRC research course

- ✓ Having a manuscript returned from a publisher with the note, "...cannot be accepted in its present form..." is actually a good thing! According to Dr. Jonathan Shuster, UF Research Professor in the Department of Epidemiology and Health Policy Research, when a journal says they cannot accept your article in current form, always pay attention to the reviewers' remarks, make the appropriate changes, and resubmit. "Getting a 'present form' comment is far different than a flat-out rejection," Shuster said.
- ✓ When submitting an Informed Consent remember financial compensation is not considered a benefit to the participant; compensation is listed the compensation section. When listing the benefits, first discuss benefits to the individual followed by benefits to society. (Source: Terry Lemesh, Education Coordinator, IRB office).

"I would not be doing any of this without their support and guidance," Kelly said. "They make research tolerable and rewarding for me!"


